

Congratulations to our Seamanship students. All five students, Lawrence Marentette, Junko Stevenson, Randy Stevenson, Albert Vair and Shih-Chieh Yin, passed the course. Several of them missed an important question that is covered in Basic Boating and Seamanship, so it is worth repeating here; When refueling, the boat should be closed up - hatches, portholes, windows, doors etc. all closed - so gas fumes can not seep into the cabin or hull. After fueling, put the cap on the fuel input pipe and then open all those doors and windows to ventilated the cabin and hull to remove any fumes that may have gotten in, before starting the engine.

Safety Message

When refueling, the boat should be closed up - hatches, portholes, windows, doors etc. all closed - so gas fumes can not seep into the cabin or hull. After fueling, all those doors and windows should be opened and the cabin and bilge ventilated to remove any fumes that may have gotten in, before starting the engine. Gasoline fumes are heavier than air and can settle in the boat cabin or bilge during fueling, and build up over time to concentrations sufficient to explode. This happens occasionally and a spark can cause gasoline fumes in the cabin or bilge to explode and the boat burns up. So close up to fuel. Open up to ventilate. Then, before starting the engine, sniff the engine compartment and cabin to make sure there are no gasoline fumes in there.
