

Commander's Message Cdr. Ron Schwartz, SN




Many thanks to D/C Dawn Flynn, for braving the coldest weather of the season and bad traffic to drive from Lansing to Ann Arbor on January 18 to administer our Change of Watch. Maybe we should change our COW to mid April when the drive would more enjoyable. But USPS National has many functions tied to the January to December normal year -- the OD 2 form is one example.

'Change' was the theme of our D/C Dawn Flynn's JN, comments to us after she swore in our 2016 officers. It was a theme that surely applies to USPS, local squadrons, and the United States also. If we don't change to keep up with the rest of the world, we like the dinosaurs years ago, will die out. I've seen many things in our society 'die out' over the past 60 years. The USA used to have a huge imbalance in foreign trade that was positive for the United States. Now it is a huge negative for the USA. We used to manufacture clothing, electronics, machines, etc. and ship them out. Now we import them. Several local USPS squadrons have closed -- Warren, Grosse Isle, Irish Hills (Jackson) because they could not change. Ann Arbor squadron is limping along with about 32 members, 8 of which do most of the work and are getting too old to continue much longer. Free DNR/Sheriff basic boating courses and on-line basic boating courses by BoatU.S., BoatEd, and USPS are cutting into our teaching business. Our ABC course is more fun because we have charting along with the drudge memory part of state boating laws. We can teach the charting, navigation, weather, electronics, etc. after the students get their boat driver's license. USPS National is doing a great job in updating our course material. But we need to change something at the local squadron level -- I don't know what --- maybe the younger members can tell us -- to get more younger members involved in teaching our advanced courses.

Lt/C Jeannine, the squadron's newly elected Administrative Officer, has worked steadily to develop an excellent series of programs for our spring AASPS meetings.

February 15th – P/C John, AP and Lt/C Marlene Barr will describe a Great Lakes Odyssey. As a youngster, I remember watching those greyhounds of the lakes, Canadian Pacific's Keewatin and Assiniboia cruise silently up the St. Mary's River. Their deep steam whistles signaled their approach to the dock. Marlene and John's cruise last summer from Montreal to Chicago will be a time to relive the romance of the heyday of passenger steamers on the Great Lakes. They transited the Welland Canal, up the Detroit and St. Clair Rivers with a stop at Little Current in the North Channel, and then went on to the Soo before returning downlake to Chicago.

March 21st - Our Cdr. Ron Schwartz, SN will tell us about downloading all kinds of maps and charts electronically. Ron said that marine charts are his hobby so this will be an interesting presentation. All of us learned boating on the wonderful NOAA charts, but they are expensive so downloading may become a usefull skill. Marine charts are available through commercial sources. However, I am not destroying my old NOAA charts because they may become collector's items in the future and appreciate in value. NOAA certified chart printers are listed at http://www.nauticalcharts.noaa.gov/mcd/OnLineViewer.html They have charts from all over the world. To see a pdf of a chart go to http://www.charts.noaa.gov/PDFs/PDFs.shtml A much better way to see charts is to use OpenCPN at http://opencpn.org/

April 18th – I will talk about Big Changes at the Panama Canal. This presentation will start with a description of the role of the Canal in medical history, then a cruise through the Canal, will conclude with a discussion of the impact of the new locks on the entire American transportation system. The Panamax or E-class ocean freighters that can transit the new locks may almost be revolutionary.

May 16th – Lt. Freddy Ohou will take us to The Ivory Coast – My Homeland. Freddy grew up in the Ivory Coast where his father was a bank executive. "Ivory Coast" suggests high adventure in a far distant land, a land that I will likely never visit but Freddy will take us there in words and pictures. Freddy's talk will be a once in lifetime opportunity to learn more about a distant part of the world.

I hope you will join us for these exciting programs as well as the good food at the Carlyle Grill. Most importantly is the good fellowship of our Ann Arbor Sail and Power Squadron, "The Friendly Squadron."

Great Lakes Cruising Club School Webinars available to USPS members at discount.

All GLCC on-line cruising-related webinars are available to USPS members at reduced USPS registration rates. Note that there is now a NEW discount code for the coming year, so be sure to use this new discount code when signing up for a webinar. Details are available on the USPS GLCCSchool web page. Live, real time on-screen presentations with visual aids provide an opportunity for participants to interact with the instructor and each other in a virtual classroom. Sessions typically run 60-90 minutes.

If scheduling doesn't allow someone to attend a live webinar, he or she have an opportunity to view a recording of the live event on demand at a later date. In addition, selected previously broadcast webinars are periodically made available for recording-only registration.

On average webinar registration is only \$20.00, discounted to \$15.00 for current Great Lakes Cruising Club (GLCC), United States Power Squadron (USPS) and Canadian Power and Sail Squadron (CPS) members.

Executive Officer's Message P/C Frank Hoy, JN



Greetings to Everyone,

There is a memorial at the northern rest area of the Sunshine Skyway bridge for the 35 people who lost their lives on May 9, 1980, when a freighter ran into the bridge. This bridge crosses the opening into Tampa Bay from the Gulf of Mexico. The freighter, Summit Venture, 606 feet in length, lost control in a sudden storm, and struck the bridge, causing a section of the southbound lanes to fall into the water. 6 cars, and a Greyhound bus went off the bridge and into the water. When the new bridge was built, they put huge concrete bumpers around the supports for the bridge to prevent a repeat of this tragedy. The bumpers have been hit by ships and proved their worth by preventing any damage to the bridge. They also changed the angle at which ships approach the bridge, and they widened the opening under the bridge for the ships. This memorial reminds us of how critical safety on the water is. Boating safety and navigation skills are essential in operating a boat. I ask you take a minute to pay your respect to those unfortunate souls that died in this tragedy.

I have also sent along a photo of a huge dredge that helps keep the canal open from Tampa Bay to the Gulf of Mexico. The bottom of Gulf of Mexico is constantly changing and needs attention all the time to ensure that the shipping channels are kept open.


