

Commander's Message Cdr. Ron Schwartz, SN


This year D9 has three functions. The Spring Conference is at Shanty Creek resort in Bellaire MI. 1-3 May. The Bristol Bay Cruise is on the Detroit Rver in June, and the Fall Conference may be a joint conference with the District 29, south of us.

Why join USPS? USPS has lots of great courses that you may enjoy even though you never use them on your boat; Celestial navigation (using a sextant), Weather (understanding global air circulation, trade winds, high and low pressure regions, warm and cold fronts, wind patterns, etc.), Engine Maintenance, looking at digital nautical charts, and others. See page 6 for courses and seminars.

We enjoy paddling our canoes and kayaks together, but it would be more fun, and safer, if we could all get into one bigger boat and paddle together. A small Viking crew boat with a classic Whitehall hull, about 25' LOA and 8' beam, 3' freeboard, with 5 paddlers on each side, that could hold about 10 people and an enclosed Head might be attractive and not limited to small lakes and rivers. One large boat could be rented or owned and shared by several squadrons. And older people that have difficulty with small kayaks and canoes could more easily enter into and ride in a larger, more stable boat. This would put some 'meat' into the phrase 'America's Boating Club', and might attract more members. We could trailer it, and cruise Lake St. Clair and the Detroit River.

The map below shows the squadrons in Michigan. Ann Arbor Sail and Power Squadron is the western most squadron in SE Michigan. There is lots of space, and people west of us that are potential members.
