Commander's Message Cdr. Ron Schwartz, SN



USPS National has developed a new course -- Marine Navigation (N1). This course was recently developed by USPS and replaces Chapter 5 of the old ABC -- America's Boating Course. Chapter 5 was 30 pages long. Marine Navigation is 221 pages long. It is not yet in print. It can be downloaded thru the internet. It is in the Beta stage of development -- looking for people to take the course and find any errors. Subjects include Compass Corrections (TVMDC), course plotting, Tides and Currents very briefly, downloading and using OpenCPN, and a practice Cruise on Bowditch Bay that is done on the digital OpenCPN Bowditch Bay NOAA chart. I have downloaded the course and am now doing the cruise on the digital Bowditch Bay chart. When you right click on a route line and click on 'Route Properties' and enter your speed, it lists waypoint locations, true directions, and distances, and travel times, and a lot more. The appendices have some computer skills such as Copy and Paste, PrtSc, and placing a degree sign ° in your text. Here is how to do it on my lap top computer:

Place the cursor where you want the degree sign °.

Turn on Num Lock at the right side of the keypad.

Press and release the Fn key on the left side bottom row.

Press and hold down the Alt key.

Press and release 0 1 7 6 on the number pad on the right side of the keypad. Release the Alt key, and you have a ° sign.





MARQUETTE'S DEATH


On May 18, 1675, Father Jacques Marquette, the great Jesuit missionary and explorer, died and was buried by two French companions somewhere along the Lake Michigan shore of the lower peninsula. Marquette had been returning to his mission at St. Ignace which he had left in 1673 to go on an exploring trip to the Mississippi and the Illinois country. The exact location of Marquette's death has long been a subject of controversy. Evidence presented in the 1960's indicates that this site, near the natural outlet of the Betsie River, at the northeast corner of a hill which was here until 1900, is the Marquette death site and that the Betsie is the Rivière du Père Marquette of early French accounts and maps. Marquette's bones were reburied at St. Ignace in 1677.
