

Commander's Message

The USPS annual meeting for 2009 was held in Anaheim, California February 17 to 21, 2009. Marlene (wife and squadron treasurer) and I attended. The main meetings were held on Friday and Saturday the 19th and 20th. The earlier days were mostly national and district working meetings. Meetings of squadron interest were on Friday. The meeting on Saturday consisted of reports in the morning and action items in the afternoon including the election of the new national bridge.

The districts hosted hospitality rooms on Friday evening. District 9 and District Commander Brooks hosted a very nice, well attended hospitality suite. A Change of Watch dinner dance was held on Saturday evening. Dress was formal, class A with

bow tie. Men wore uniforms or a suit or tux. Ladies wore fine evening wear. It was a nice event with a live band and good food. Marlene and I enjoyed the dancing and especially visiting with members of other District 9 Squadrons.

I came away from the meeting with several thoughts. The USPS is doing a great job in creating education programs for safe boating. The materials are really great and second to none. Recognizing the fact that this is all volunteer effort, the USPS and its members deserve a lot of credit.

The finances of USPS are sound, but there is a lot of room for improvement. The present bridge and officers are taking a much closer look at finances and will be cutting out unnecessary dead wood. The national Ship Store is losing money and may well be privatized. Perks and travel expenses for lower rank officers may well be a thing of the past. We in the AASPS will have to be careful and watch our funds to make sure we are able to weather this economic downturn.

Uniforms may well be phased out in the future. The Canadian Power Squadron has already done away with uniforms. This issue, as with most, has a lot of emotional baggage. Personally I favor uniforms, but I am admittedly "old school." I expect that there will be a gradual relaxation of wearing of uniforms – it has already occurred, and that there will be a move toward a polo shirt, tan slacks type of attire for squadron functions. Of course, there never was a <u>requirement</u> of wearing a uniform to any USPS event.

On a side note, I do have a uniform (now about 30 years old) and wore it at the national meeting Change of Watch. We took a cruise to Mexico after the national meeting. There were several formal nights on the cruise and I opted to wear my class A uniform with bow tie for the formal night cruise dinners so I did not have to bring a tux or other formal attire. The uniform was well received and I was able to promote USPS. (We visited P/Cs Dick and Katie Sullivan in Florida a while ago and they suggested taking along the "This is USPS" information brochures to hand out. I did and did.) At one of the shows on the cruise a gentleman, from the Canadian Power Squadron came up and talked to us because of seeing my uniform.

I came away from the National meeting with good thoughts and feelings about USPS and AASPS and our mission to teach safe boating. I encourage all members to step up and help us move forward to educate the public in safe boating!

Frank is currently in Florida checking out a cruiser that he will to bring to Michigan if everything go according to plans. I have a copy of the new ABC-3 (Americas Boating Course, 3rd edition). It is replacing the old Squadron Boating Course. It can be used for an 8 hour course - similar to the Michigan DNR Safe Boating Course, or our full Boating Course including charting. Other squadrons are advertising the full course as an 8 to 10 week (16 to 20 hour) course. It can be purchased directly from USPS as an internet course and comes with a text book, course CD and the Maptech CD (digital charting). Students can study at home or take our classroom course, or a mix of the two if they miss a few days of our classroom course. We will be using this course for our Washtenaw Community College Boating Course.

USPS offers lots of courses, study guides, and seminars for our members and the boating public. Look at www.USPS.org, and let us know which of these you want to study. We can use more teachers. Would you like take and/or teach a 2-3 hour seminar on Marine Radar/GPS, or Celestial Sight Reduction, or Weather? We have them and many more.

US Customs and Border Protection have changed border crossing requirements, so this is your chance to make your travels trouble free.

PLANNED GIFTS BENEFIT USPS

Planned Giving is a program of various financial instruments that can be adapted to the needs of each donor. When the "Gift" is properly and correctly set up, it will provide future income for the nonprofit (USPS). This "Gift" is also known as "deferred giving". "Gifts" can be made by using many types of assets. Most asset contributions are made with cash or appreciated marketable securities. Depending on the donor's particular circumstances, "Gifts" can also be made using qualified retirement account assets, real estate, insurance policies and even artwork or business interests.

A donor using planned giving techniques has a variety of benefits such as increasing current income for the donor or others. You can also reduce income and/or estate taxes, reduce or avoid capital gains taxes, pass assets on to family members at reduced tax costs and make an important gift to USPS. Think of "Planned Gifts" as leaving a legacy that benefits not only the donor and the donor's family, but also nonprofits (USPS). "Gifts" designated to the USPS Endowment Fund are invested in an account separate from other assets/ investments of USPS. R/C Michael Horowitz, JN explains how these funds are managed by the Finance Committee. "The investment philosophy is very conservative and preservation of the principal is paramount. Currently the investment mix is 75% money market instruments, such as certificates of deposit and money market funds, and 25% in mutual funds with reinvestment of dividends and capital gains. Income from the "Gifts" will be used to fund initiatives that support strategic issues facing our organization."

You may be wondering how and why you fit into this program; read one member's prospective. "Now that I (P/C/C Les Johnson, SN) am not on the National Bridge, it has been a source of great satisfaction to be able to talk with more members and be re-involved with my Squadron and District. There is one subject that frequently comes up in conversation when visiting Districts and Squadrons. Members have thought about making "Gifts" to USPS, but they are not sure how the money would be used. Some examples of past "Gifts" include \$40,000 plus to cover mentoring costs to start new squadrons, \$400,000 plus to upgrade and enlarge the headquarters building, \$3,000 plus for a defibrillator for headquarters and national meetings, and lastly a \$500,000 "Gift" was made to the Century Fund."

All of the above are a few examples of how "Planned Gifts" have helped provide the resources that are needed to best promote boating education. Did you notice that the amount of the "Gifts" vary from small to large? There are additional future projects that are needed. It is easy to ask the Planned Giving Committee for some direction for making a "Gift" you might have in mind. Remember, it is the accumulation of all "Gifts" to the USPS (big and small) that get things accomplished.
