



You should have received the March issue of Mooring Lines from the Mt. Clemons Squadron. The issue contained an excellent article on entering and returning from Canada. I believe that anyone who cruises near Canadian water should read the article. Cruising is not considered entry but anchoring in Canadian waters is an entry. The procedure for entering Canada is the same as in the past. Merely call Canadian Immigration and provide the requested information which will include vessel registration number.

Returning to the United States is the issue. Due to enhanced homeland security, each person on board, except children under age 17, must have a form I-64 or Nexus card. If available, then entry into the U.S. can be done by telephone. Failure to follow the procedures can be quite expensive. I also learned that if the vessel is 30' or more, a DTOPS decal is required. I was asked for my decal number for our 30'Catalina. When puzzled, the officer with a sense of humor said, "Captain, I believe that your boat is only 29" I said, "yes of course, my error."
