

General Meeting Monday, Nov. 15, 2010



Wow, am I learning a lot! I just finished teaching the sections on charting and navigation for the Boating Course. The new materials stress electronic navigation, something that was not in existence when I took Advanced Piloting covering dead reckoning navigation. Although I have used a GPS- Chart Plotter for several years, and studied the materials, there is always something new to learn in each USPS class. And leading the class or proctoring the class is an excellent way to learn and teach.

We have many excellent students in our classes and many students with a lot of boating experience. We have an airplane pilot in our present Boating class. Airplane pilots need to know a lot about navigation. They have to learn navigation for their pilot's license. Piloting Class: Art Pinsak started a USPS Piloting class at the Education Center at St. Joseph's Hospital at 7pm Tuesday night Nov. 2 with 7 students. This will continue for about another 8 or 9 Tuesdays.

Spring 2011 ABC3 classes will start Wednesday 23 Feb. 2011 at WCC Ann Arbor, and Tuesday 8 Mar. 2011 at WCC branch in Lincoln High School.

With the new directives from USPS National we can teach any course to anyone - member or nonmember. Therefore, we will try to have a class for any course USPS offers if we can get enough students. We have 1 Piloting course student, 3 Advanced Piloting course students and 2 Navigation course students doing a self study.



Virtual (Computer and Internet) Cruising

With computer tools and programs like Map Tech, Coastal Pilot, Capn and OpenCPC, I enjoy planning a cruise and following it on the nautical charts and on Google Earth. Map Tech, Coastal Pilot, and Capn came with the Basic Boating, ABC3, and N course material. Curtis Hoff told us about OpenCPN. It uses free NOAA nautical charts. It is a free Chart Plotter program that can be downloaded on the internet, and, if you connect your GPS to your computer, it will show you where your boat is on the chart. Google Earth is a free download that shows satellite pictures of earth, and , when you zoom in you can click on scenic photos of locations on the earth that other people have submitted. So, while setting in your home, you can cruise anywhere on earth and view the scenery. Also, my friends e-mail me many scenic pictures from places all over the world.


Secretary's Comment





D/9-D/29 Fall Conference - 2010

The joint D/9-D/29 Fall Conference 22-24 October 2010 in Perrysburg, OH was both educational and entertaining. This was the first time in my memory that two districts combined their efforts, and it was great because everyone seemed to be exceptionally cordial. Not only was there opportunity to refresh acquaintances but also to meet new people, although four from the Toledo PS were friends who had attended a recent AASPS Christmas party. Of course, most of you would not have had the opportunity to meet them in Ann Arbor. Registration was about 200 D/9 and 100 D/29 members. Meeting facilities were attractive and more than met our needs. Hospitality rooms Friday evening surrounded a large atrium dotted with ponds and swimming pools and were all on the same level. No traipsing up and down stairwells and long hallways this time.

People, incidentally most wore costumes, were all together and socialized at tables in the atrium. Boaters may be focused on the water but they surely know how to party. Only shortfall was the number of hospitality rooms; ten hosted by D/9 squadrons and three by D/29 squadrons. However, the hosts more than made up for the relatively low numbers.

Saturday morning seminar schedule included four from 0800-0950 and four from 1010-1200. Selection was limited because three were for specific bridge officers. One covered the same VHF/DSC material that Bob Buchanan presented in Ann Arbor at our most recent meeting. The seminar on updating a website was educational as pertains both to format and content. Birmingham used their site as a basis for presentation. This was as comprehensive a site as one could imagine; the webmaster said it is the culmination of four years effort. The seminar I personally found most beneficial was Instructor Recertification. It is unfortunate that so many people failed to take advantage of this opportunity because it was convenient and accessible. I obviously could not view all seminars but wondered where the 300 registered participants were; seventeen in one seminar and thirty-four in the other. Observers reported large crowds gathered in the atrium; hopefully to conduct USPS business.

A principal agenda item at the Fall Conference business meeting is recognition of individual and squadron achievements and award of certificates and revolving trophies. Awards include such items as highest number of advanced and elective courses completed by a squadron, greatest percentage completed which neutralizes squadron size differences, number of N graduates, aggregate course completions, outstanding sailor, predicted log, outstanding teacher, most vessel safety checks, coop charting, best teaching aid, membership increase. Ann Arbor was blanked out this year. We were not even recognized as one of the top three in any category; kind of depressing for the squadron generally regarded as an academic achiever. Achievement generally is cyclical wherein a group of interested students comes in and decides to run the gamut of courses. For example, South Bend could have set up camp at the awards table this year.

R/C Kenneth Link, SN carried the USPS Commander's message to the business meeting. Keep up the good work with membership. After 1 December the only national membership category will be "Active". New members will be entitled to free six month membership post 1 December. He also discussed National views on course fees for non-members and lauded the quality of current course offerings.

"Sail Angle" was described in the Porthole after the spring D/9 conference. It is a critical communications tool and is free. We continue to be admonished to enroll in the program. It is much faster and more secure than email. D/9 currently has 2088 members but only 218 are "Sail Angle" members. Sign in! (link on main page of usps.org) A new seminar - Boating on Rivers, Locks and Lakes - has recently become available.

The semiannual District Conferences offer a means to stay current with all the precepts and activities of USPS. We need to take advantage of this opportunity through increased participation.
