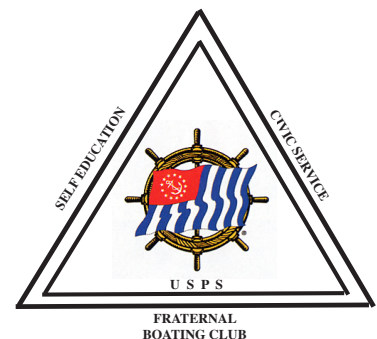

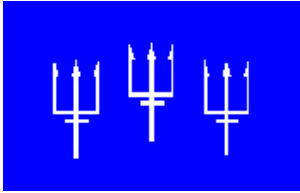

Commander's Message Comm. John Barr, AP, Life

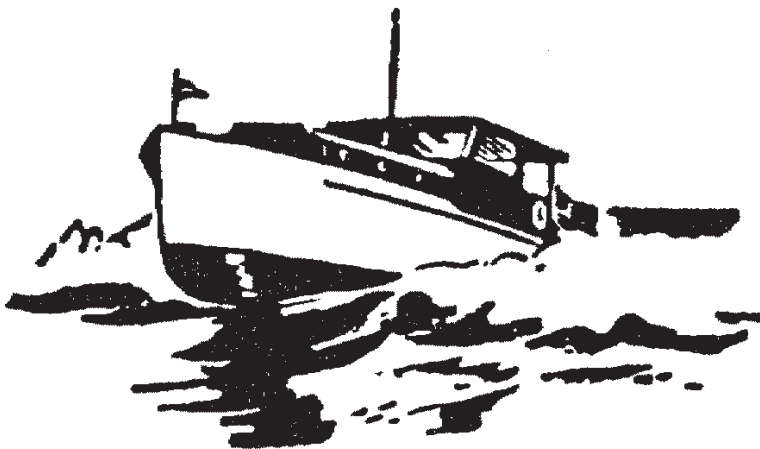

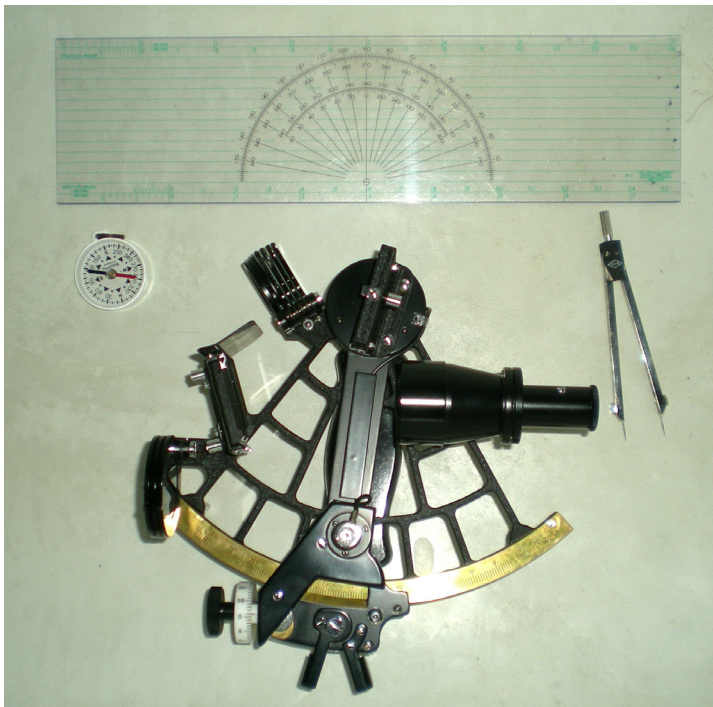
Piloting Class: Art Pinsak is teaching 7 students the USPS Piloting class at the Education Center at St. Joseph's Hospital at 7pm on Tuesday nights.

Spring 2011 ABC3 classes will start Wednesday 23 Feb. 2011 at WCC Ann Arbor, and Tuesday 8 Mar. 2011 at WCC branch in Lincoln High School.

With the new directives from USPS National, we can teach any course to anyone - member or nonmember. This gives us a wider pool of potential students. Therefore, we will try to have a class for any course USPS offers if we can get enough students.

To have a class we must first have a class chairman, then schedule the class, then advertise it in the Porthole. We need people to volunteer to be class chairmen for each course and seminar USPS offers, such as Marine Electronics, Engine Maintenance, etc.

Teachers of our first public boating class must be certified. This is done by passing the Instructor Qualification course. The certification is good for 4 years. Recertification can be accomplished by attending a recertification seminar, either at a district meeting or elsewhere.

December 6 will be our last meeting of the year and be the traditional holiday party. Unfortunately I will not be able to attend since I am traveling to China and India during that time.

Important notice to everyone using the USPS website.

Until 2009 USPS website security was based on your Certificate number and your ZIP code. While this was adequate for securing information of interest only to USPS members, it was not sufficiently robust to safeguard members' personal information.

Although the USPS website will continue to support login by Certificate/ZIP code, it is in your best security interest to move to PIN based security as soon as possible.

After the 2010 Fall Governing Board, a distinction will be made between ZIP (untrusted) logons and PIN (trusted) logons. Only trusted logons will have access to functions and data which are based on jobs held or will be able to make online data updates.

To activate your PIN based security, you must first select a security question and provide the answer. Once you have done this, you will be converted from a ZIP based logon to the more robust PIN based logon. This will prevent someone, other than yourself, from logging on using your Certificate/ZIP code and potentially compromising your personal information.

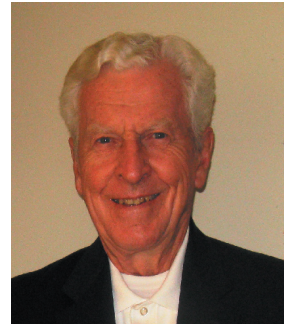

Secretary's Message Lt/C Robert Buchanan, P



Jeannine and I have almost finished teaching the USPS ABC course to 8 students at Lincoln High School south of Ypsilanti. Commander John wrote about his experiences teaching the same course at Washtenaw Community College (WCC) in the last Porthole so here are a few more thoughts. First, the Lincoln Community Education department asked WCC to provide a course to start an academic adult program. The ABC course was selected as the "lead" course.

Instructing 8 students from diverse backgrounds (veterinarian, nurse, engineers, etc) has been a real challenge. All are taking the course to seek greater nautical knowledge, not because of any requirement. None have missed a class. Their questions are probing and perceptive so faking an answer is out of the question because each is thoroughly prepared.

One lecture covers fire, grounding, collisions, and propeller strikes. When finished, I worried that I had scared everyone and they might give up any further nautical plans. Then Jeannine asked one student why he was in the course. His answer was "I love being on the water." This reply makes the many hours of lecture preparation well worth the effort. This simple statement is really why all of us participate in AASPS.

Ron Schwartz and I teach the ABC course so that students are prepared to also take the Michigan DNR boating safety test which gives each a Michigan boating safety certificate. This certificate is valid in all states except 3 (Utah, Colorado, and Connecticut). In other words, Michigan has wide reciprocity. Actually the certificate is a requirement to rent any boat in Florida, as I found out.

Another benefit of USPS membership is that any navigation instruments can be purchased online from Weems and Plath for an automatic 25% discount. This is described on the USPS website, and works.

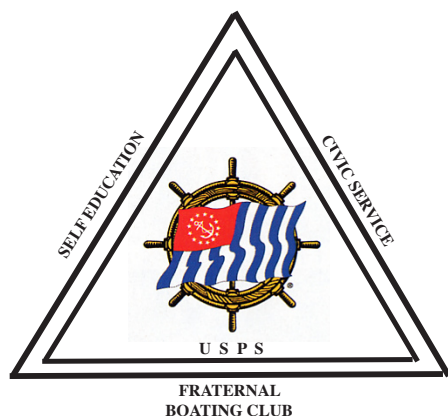


Executive Officer's Message P/C Frank Hoy, JN
