General Meeting Monday, Jan. 10, 2011



Education Officer's Message L/C Ron Schwartz, SN, Life





Secretary's Message Lt/C Robert Buchanan, P



This summer, which is not far away, will herald the arrival of Rescue 21, a major improvement in boating safety in the Detroit area, but 1 year behind the planned schedule. Rescue 21 was simulated at a recent squadron meeting, also described at the District Conference. Here is a fast summary for folks interested but who missed either of these presentations. Fixed-mounted marine radios sold in the past few years are required to have the ability to transmit a digital (not voice) distress signal on Channel 70. The digital transmission requires <3 seconds and includes the MMSI (Mobile Marine Service Identity) number which identifies both the boat and owner, also the nature of the distress - if entered. If your GPS is connected, your location will also be included. The Coast Guard then replies to the distress call on Channel 16. The advantages of a digital signal on Channel 70 are obvious, disadvantages are minimal.

The major advance provided by Rescue 21 is that the distressed boat making the transmission can easily be located by triangulation. Two receivers, for example mounted on cell phone towers, will locate the boat. The BoatUS website contains a splendid tutorial under the "boating safety" menu.

My problem is that our marine radio is located in the navigator's station. This means that I must leave the helm station, go down the companionway, get into the navigator's desk, reach up and make the transmission, all during an emergency situation. However, handheld transceivers are now available which include both the Channel 70 sending capability and a GPS unit. This means that a distress call will automatically transmit location using the new handhelds, all without leaving the helm station. This should be considered before purchasing any new marine radio equipment. Finally, the Digital Selective Calling system has largely been replaced by cellular telephones according to the USCG
