

General Meeting Monday, May 16, 2011




There is nothing quite like May in Michigan. Green grass, flowers, birds singing, blue skies, white clouds and sunshine make Michigan a truly fine place to be in May.

The boating season is starting, and there will be lots of people on our waterways for fun and adventure. We in Ann Arbor Sail and Power Squadron can be proud that we have given our students the knowledge to enjoy boating in a safe manner. Unfortunately there are thousands, perhaps millions of boaters out there that have not had any basic boating training.

Canada and several states, including Alabama, Florida, Oregon, North Carolina, Washington, Pennsylvania, New York, New Jersey, Ohio, Mississippi, Virginia and Wisconsin now require boaters to have a certificate from a boating safety course in order to operate a boat. Michigan, the "water wonderland" should follow suit and have a boater safety law requiring at least basic boating knowledge. A state certificate or license would be evidence of completing the course. I think this is a good idea, and if you agree contact your Michigan representative or senator and let him/her know your position.

Our squadron planning retreat will be held May 9th in one of the 2nd floor classrooms at the Education Building of Saint Joseph Hospital in Ann Arbor. We will start at 6 pm with a pot luck dinner and then move into the retreat. We will consider who we are, where we are and where we want to go as a squadron. We need the ideas of all members. The AASPS dues schedule for the next fiscal year is displayed in the above table. However, when you actually receive your dues notice depends on when you joined USPS. For example, Jeannine and I joined in November, so our statement comes in October. The USPS dues system has been reduced to 5 categories as shown in the table. Single Active means one active member. As seen in the first column, this is the largest category for AASPS. But if both husband and wife are active members, they will pay the Family Active rate rather than paying 2 Single Active dues. See the difference this makes in the total dues column on the right. Both contribute \$1 to the National Fund, an educational fund. Any additional members in the same family also contribute to the National Fund.

Life membership requires receiving 25 merit marks. We have 4 life members in our squadron also 2 families where 1 has achieved life status.

Your squadron dues are unchanged. However, the National Dues have a \$2.00 increase from last year for Single Active members, \$3.00 for Family Active members. USPS has worked hard to minimize any increases so that membership remains affordable. The modest increase supports the educational programs, also boating safety such as the vessel inspection programs. When all of the vast array of benefits are considered, USPS membership continues to be one of the best bargains for boaters.
