




Joshua Slocum - sailed solo around the world in 1895-1898

Commander's Message Cdr. Robert Buchanan, P



My first task as the 2012 Ann Arbor Sail and Power Squadron Commander is to sincerely thank our Past Commander, John Barr, for his 3 years of outstanding leadership. During this time, the squadron has flourished in several ways. Our financial position is strong, the educational programs have a broad base, the Vessel Safety Check (VSC) was started and will continue. But typical of John who has a big heart, he has already volunteered to accept an assignment as squadron PRO, public relations officer. This means that AASPS can tell the USPS story that "Boating is fun, we will show you how."

VSC is important because our squadron is "land-locked" or many miles away from the open waters of the Great Lakes. This means that the VSC program will be conducted on inland lakes.

Our meetings will be held at the Classic Cup, a restaurant west of Ann Arbor out Jackson Road in a mall on the south side just past the Lexus dealer. The Classic Cup has been described as "a little gem" or one of Ann Arbors' best kept secrets with really good food, drinks available, all served by Jennifer the Waitress with a big smile. Service is prompt so that we can have a social time, then dinner before the program and squadron meeting, yet adjourn at a reasonable hour. The meetings will start at 6:00 pm but I hope people will arrive about 5:45 pm in time for a drink together. Here are the programs for the days ahead.

February 22nd . SEO Ron Schwartz will talk about Finding Your Way. Ron's presentation will describe some world solo sailors, celestial navigation, pilot charts, and the Advanced Piloting course. This program should not be missed by boaters interested in these advanced courses to achieve a higher level of boating proficiency.

March 28th. I will describe The Lakes in Winter. This date is selected because the Great Lakes Navigation season starts March 25th when the Soo Locks open. This entertaining slide show will include storms on Lake Superior, freighters stuck in the ice, icebreakers at work, pilots changing ships, the beauty of the Great Lakes.

April 25th. John and Marlene Barr are planning a cultural presentation, The Waterways of India, based on their recent travels. The rivers are an integral part of the Hindu religion as well as the history and life of India.

May 22nd (Tuesday). AO Curtis Hoff will describe his experiences Cruising along the East Coast. This will include a look at ports, navigation, fascinating events as well as an introduction to his boat.

We are already working on programs for next fall. Would you like to travel on a U. S. Navy nuclear submarine, search for wrecks off Thunder Bay, go deep inside a 30 foot sailboat? These are just a few of our plans.

I hope that you share my enthusiasm for the days ahead with our squadron.



The *U88 Michigan*, was involved in King James Strang's career, and his assasination on Beaver Island in Lake Michigan in 1856, and the failed Rebel assault on Johnson's Island prisoner camp in Lake Erie, during the Civil War. It was the U.S. Navy's first iron-hulled warship. Launched in 1843, she operated on the Great Lakes for her entire career, was later renamed Wolverine and was decommissioned in 1912. 
Executive Officer's Message P/C Frank Hoy, JN


