

Commander's Message Cdr. Robert Buchanan, P



The exciting event in the life of the squadron is the ABC program in progress at Washtenaw Community College (WCC). The course has 20 students about equally divided between those who registered through the USPS website and through the WCC catalogue and website. Several have come by "word of mouth" or based on information that they received at the Detroit Boat Show. They range from students with large powerboats to several who are completely new to boating, anxious to learn more about boat life. We also have 5 families.

The total number means that the room is almost completely filled. The room is designed for a maximum of 24; we have 20. Several calls were received after the start date so they were referred to the Dearborn squadron which has the same program starting about 4 weeks after our Ann Arbor program.

SEO Ronald Schwartz and Dr. Larry Marentette have shared the teaching responsibilities. Our squadron's problem is finding additional teaching faculty. WCC has requested that we present the course more often. Also another community college would like to have the ABC course, but this requires more instructors. I would be pleased to talk to anyone who has an interest in teaching boating skills.

Our next squadron program on March 28th will be The Great Lakes in Winter. This slide show will describe how the system closes for the winter, but what shipping routes remain open, types of weather that can be expected, and the role of icebreakers. I also expect to report to the squadron about new information from the District 9 conference being held in Bay City on the previous weekend.



First, Commander Bob and I have just made our plans to attend the D9 Spring Conference in Bay City. I believe that this attendance is important to maintain a link between our squadron, the district bridge, and other squadrons with similar interests and issues. In other words, we may be able to learn from other squadron's strengths so that our Ann Arbor Sail and Power Squadron is not existing in isolation.

Second, we have been surprised at the number of phone calls to our home from people interested in the ABC course. When asked, the callers have reported that they obtained our contact number from the USPS booth at the Detroit Boat Show, not from the USPS website nor the Washtenaw Community College catalogue. This means that the USPS boat show booth indeed is providing a real outreach to folks interested in safe boating. Each squadron is asked for volunteers to devote 2 hours to the boat show booth; I can state that this is important time well spent.

I have not been able to accommodate all of the callers, either because our ABC course at Washtenaw Community College had filled, or because they called after the start date. However, I have worked hard to direct them to other nearby courses that were available.

Small Vessel Reporting System (SVRS) for US Border Crossings

As part of the Customs and Border Protection (CBP) comprehensive effort to improve security of our nation's borders while enhancing legitimate travel for small boaters, CBP has implemented the Small Vessel Reporting System.

Overview: SVRS enables boaters to report their arrival from foreign waters quickly and easily to CBP with a telephone call from their landing port. It is a free, easy to use, voluntary program that you enroll for on-line.

Eligibility: SVRS is available to all U.S. citizens, nationals and lawful permanent residents.

Canadian citizens and permanent residents of Canada who are nationals of a Visa Wavier Program Country, Current Local Boater Option participants, Trusted Traveler Program (NEXUS) members, and current holders of I-68 (Canadian Border Landing Permits) must apply for enrollment in SVRS on-line in order to participate, but they do not need to schedule an interview with a CBP officer to complete their application.

How to Enroll: The enrollment system is Web-based. New applicants register on-line and self-schedule an interview with a CBP officer at an authorized reporting location of their choice. Participants receive a welcoming email with their Boater Registration (BR) number and password for SVRS. The system is currently deployed in Florida, Puerto, United States Virgin Islands and the U.S./Canadian border. Apply at https://svrs.cbp.dhs.gov/.

You must still call in by phone upon arrival in the U.S.

The program requires you to file a float plan on line as well, which is an important safety benefit.
