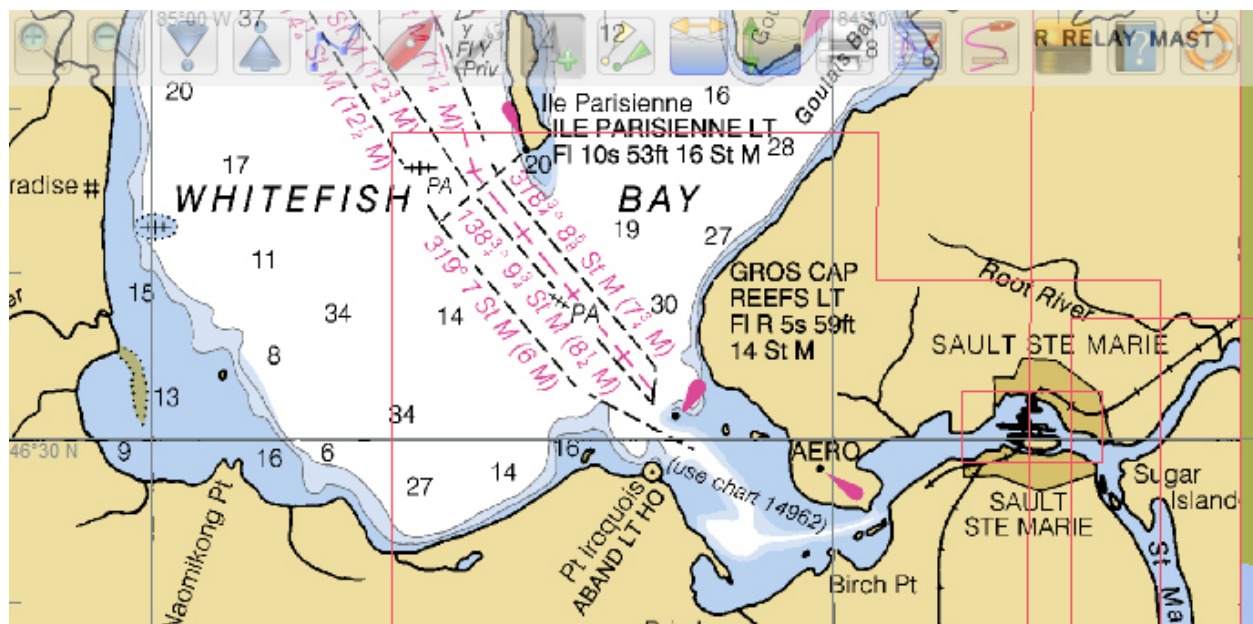

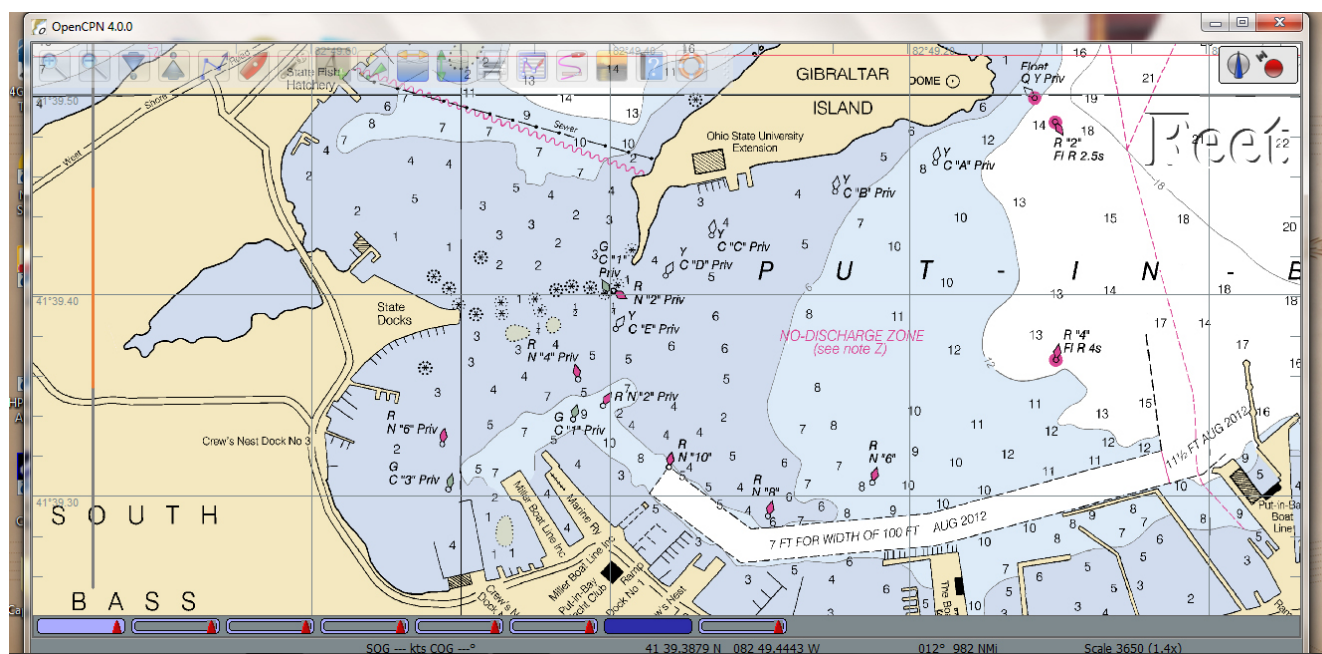

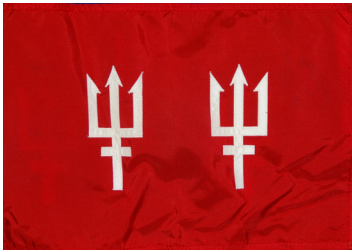
Wild rice. The September/October 2016 issue, page 16, of *Michigan History* magazine has a good article about wild rice in Michigan -- where it can be found and how to pick and process it. It grows in shallow water and is harvested in the fall when the leaves are turning color. Dredging and the timber industry - floating logs to the mill - have destroyed many wild rice beds. Large wild rice beds can still be found in Tawas Lake near East Tawas, and Lac Vieux Desert - 46.13°N 89.12°W - near the Michigan/Wisconsin border. Hand picked and processed rice costs about \$10 to \$12 a pound.

Why a Ship is Called She; This "analogy" was submitted by Lt Fred Devantier, SN. It was published in the Oyster Bar, Fisherman's Village in Punta Gorda, FL.

A Ship is called "she" because there is always a great deal of bustle around her; there is always a gang of men about. She has a waist and stays; it takes a lot of paint to keep her looking good. It's not the initial expense that breaks you, it is the upkeep, she can be all decked out. It takes an experienced man to handle her correctly; and without a man at the helm, she is absolutely uncontrollable. She shows her topsides, hides her bottom and when she comes into port, always heads toward the buoys.

One highlight of our summer was spending a very warm summer day at a friend's cottage on the west side of Old Man River, the Mississippi. The cottage was directly on the Mississippi just above Lock #7 at LaCrosse, Wisconsin. We were able to locate tug and barge AIS signals on marinetraffic.com. The AIS signal gave location, origin, destination, and speed. Our handheld scanner allowed us to listen to the conversation between the captain and lockmaster. The first downbound tug was *Robin B. Ingram* (left to right). Notice the red buoy on the port side. Immediately after passing us, *Ingram* moved tightly against the western shore at the request of the lockmaster and stopped to allow 2 upbound tugs to pass. Bob tried to contact the captain on Channel 6 but suspected that he had gone below for lunch. The first upbound tug was the *Kelly Erickson* (right to left). The flags reflect the hot wind out of the south. Then *Jack Wofford* passed us; notice the green can buoy. Once clear, *Robin B. Ingram* warmed her engines and continued on down to the lock. We have 2 tips for traveling near a waterway; take your binoculars and scanner.

Boater Education in Michigan

Michigan requires boaters born after July 1, 1996 to pass a boater exam and get a Boating Safety Certificate (BSC). <https://www.boat-ed.com/michigan/handbook/> for information.

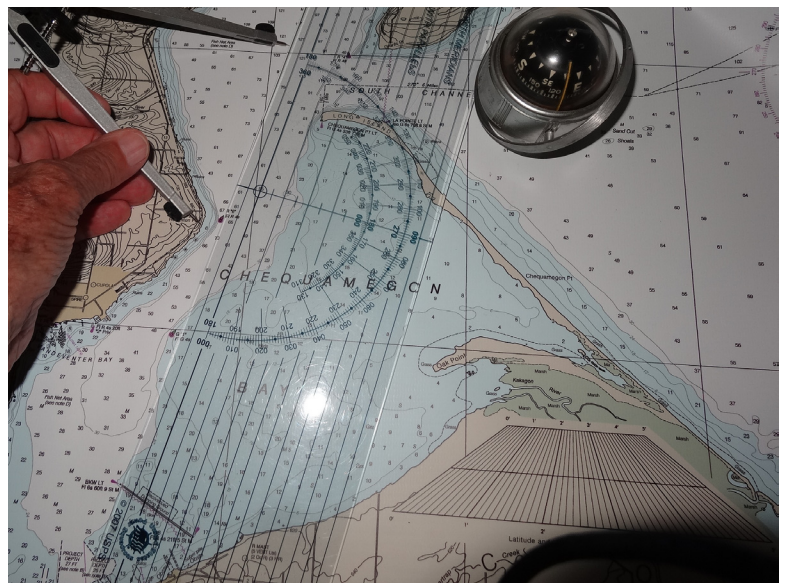
<https://www.boat-ed.com/michigan/studyGuide/10102301> has a study guide. Courses vary from on-line courses to classroom courses, and combinations of both. www.michigan.gov/boating has more information.

There are 2 types of courses. 1) the Michigan DNR 8 hour course teaches the minimum information. 2) the United States Power Squadrons (USPS) Americas Boating Course (ABC) is a 16 hour course and teaches the minimum plus navigation, GPS, Charts, and digital charts.

The local sheriff's offices give the Michigan DNR 8 hour class and BSC. Prices are \$0 to \$10 depending on the location. To find a class in your area go to <http://www.dnr.state.mi.us/recnsearch/recnsrch.asp>
