




D9 spring conference. I attended the Friday night (Mar. 24) hospitality rooms and two of the Saturday 2 hour seminars. It was educational and fun meeting old and new friends. The hospitality rooms had drinks, barbeque, coldslaw, hot dogs, soup, ice cream Sundaes, etc. -- in line with the western theme for the weekend. At the SEO seminar DEO Tom Smith, N, reviewed changes and plans in USPS education. USPS is adding more courses aimed at on the water training and certifications. These courses are described in the USPS web site. The Virtual Trainer, which is a boating simulator, can be loaned to squadrons – contact DEO Tom Smith, N. Currents is an Education Department newsletter that is issued at each Governing Board meeting. www.usps.org/eddept/misc/currents.htm. USPS is developing E-books for internet access to the various USPS courses – the ABC course is available on line, and the on line Seamanship course is in development. USPS wants us to certify some members to conduct Personal On The Water Training (POTWT) – we cannot charge for the training but we can charge for books and expenses related to the training. When teaching our ABC basic boating course, the Michigan DNR wants us to use their test to issue the blue DNR Certificates. USPS encourages squadrons to use Facebook, Twitter, etc., for advertising USPS. USPS has developed many courses, many seminars, and many guides. USPS sells Guides, but members can downloaded them free. It is used for all USPS courses and seminars, and stores the students names and other information.


AASPS is planning a boating party on a set of interconnected lakes in the Pinckney State Recreation Area in the northwest corner of Washtenaw County -- Half Moon Lake, Bruin Lake, Blind Lake, Watson lake, and Patterson Lake are all connected by small channels. Canoes and kayaks are ideal since the connecting channels are probably shallow. There is a public beach and a launch site on northeast side of Half Moon Lake. There are no boat rentals on these lakes. A camp ground on the northwest side of Bruin Lake has a launch site for campers. Munhacke Boy Scout Camp is on the south side of Bruin Lake.

Administrative Officers' Message Lt/C Jeanine and Bob Buchanan, P



Our District 9 in cooperation with the United States Coast Guard (USCG) will again conduct the Bristol Bay Cruise on June 20th. First, the Bristol Bay (102) is a 140' bay class cutter based in Detroit and assigned to maintaining navigational aids and winter ice-breaking duties. It is one of 2 that can push a barge which serves as our teaching platform. The purpose of the 4 hour evening cruise is to afford USPS students an opportunity to learn night navigation.

This cruise is the only opportunity to ride on a real working cutter on the Detroit River at night and have the "run of the ship." After leaving the dock at the foot of Mt. Elliott, the cutter generally sails down the river toward or under the Ambassador Bridge, then turns up the river, past Belle Isle, and out into Lake St. Clair. The Peche Island range is then acquired for a spectacular night return with a magnificent view of the Detroit skyline back to the station. Each student is given a chart of the river which is also projected on a large screen, enabling them to identify the various aids to navigation, especially at night.

The cutter is available for boarding at 6:30 pm, departs at 7:00 pm. Registration must be submitted well in advance in order to enter the USCG station. Arrive promptly because photo identification is required and parking at the station is somewhat limited. The return has been close to 11:00 pm.

Here are a few suggestions. 1) Bring a light jacket or sweater because the evening can become cool after sunset, 2) A flashlight such as a cellphone helps to locate your automobile because the parking lot lighting can be minimal, 3) Binoculars are good to have, 4) A marine scanner will add to your enjoyment. Sarnia Coast Guard provides vessel traffic control, can be heard on Channel 12 covering commercial ship traffic from St. Clair Light (the crib light) in the center of Lake St. Clair to Detroit Light. Although we have sailed Lake St. Clair for 20 years, I have never learned why St. Clair Light is called the crib light.


The USCG station address is 110 Mount Elliott for your GPS. From East Jefferson, Mt. Elliott is easy to find because the Customs House is at the corner of Jefferson and Mt. Elliott. For dinner in advance, Sindbad's Restaurant (Marquette Street) has good food, reasonable prices, easy parking, and is about 10 minutes east of the USCG station. Refreshments such as soda and chips are available, provided by D9 on board.

The only off-limits area is the engine room. Several years ago we took our grandson, age 12 at the time. I lost him so started to search the cutter, found him down in the engine room with one of the engineers who was describing the 2 marine diesel engines.

Sign up for a 3-hour United States Coast Guard (USCG), United States Power Squadron (USPS) and United States Coast Guard Auxiliary (USCGAUX) D/9 educational opportunity aboard the 140-ft. Coast Guard Cutter "BRISTOL BAY." The Bristol Bay will also be pushing their Aids to Navigation (floating buoys, fixed aids and ranges) barge. The barge is capable of carrying approximately 250 people. Bring binoculars if you have them, and dress warmly.

The U S Power Squadron, the U S Coast Guard and US Coast Guard Auxiliary are the world's premier marine safety organizations that take great pride in sponsoring this educational opportunity to recreational basic boating students. This will be a unique 3-hour educational opportunity aboard the 140-ft ship and its 130-ft. barge for a total of a 270 foot vessel.

We will be traveling the waters of the Detroit River and Lake St. Clair. We hope this event will provide the basic boating students with a better understanding of the aids to navigation and their light characteristics. An understanding of the aids to navigation is an essential part of safe boating, although covered in the classroom during your course; it is best understood by actually seeing the aids at sea. The timing has been planned so that daytime and evening light characteristics of the aids can be seen. During the entire voyage, a Power Squadron or Coast Guard Auxiliary member and an active duty Coast Guard Officer will provide commentary. You will see and hear about Aids to Navigation and more during our river and lake cruise. You'll have fun and improve your boating safety. Each Power Squadron and Coast Guard Auxiliary student will be given a chart replica of the river and lake areas we are going to cruise, showing the various navigational aids and their individual characteristics. They will be numbered on the chart and the actual aids and their light characteristics will be identified as we pass them.

We will begin boarding promptly at 7.00 PM at Coast Guard Station Group Detroit. This is at the foot of Mt. Elliott Avenue, right at the Detroit River. We will have personnel there to assist and direct you on parking and boarding procedures. A detailed map of the area will be mailed to you along with your boarding passes. Departure time is 7:30 P M.

CHILDREN: Children who attend the USPS or the USCGAUX Public Boating Courses are welcome to participate in this educational opportunity. However, we must restrict participation by other family members (and friends) to those 12 years of age and older. The Power Squadron and the Coast Guard Auxiliary are family oriented organizations and we sponsor many activities that include children. But, because this cruise requires the concentration of the participants, we have the age restriction. Thanks for understanding.

ABOUT USPS: Formed in 1914, the United States Power Squadrons is the world's largest nonprofit boating organization. Their 28,368 members in the 450 squadrons are boating families who contribute to their communities by promoting safe boating on the water and in the classroom. All USPS members are volunteers. USPS District 9 is composed of 1,434 members in 20 squadrons. Collectively, these 20 squadrons teach the USPS ABC3 Boating Course to residents of the Lower Peninsula of Michigan and Northern Indiana.


